The webinar titled “IKS and NEP 2020: Implementation Perspectives” was conducted on 21 February 2026 from 10:30 AM to 11:30 AM as part of the Webinar Series on Indian Knowledge System (IKS) organized by BNV College of Teacher Education, Thiruvallam, Thiruvananthapuram, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The programme was convened by Dr. Lakshmi S., Principal, with Mrs. Shiny

Pratap, Assistant Professor, as the Staff Coordinator and Aswani K. S and Amritha A. K (First Year B.Ed.) as the Student Coordinators. The session was anchored by Sreelakshmi, who guided the programme. A warm welcome speech was delivered, and Mrs. Shiny Pratap introduced the resource person. The session was conducted through Google Meet.

The resource person, Prof. Dr. Devanandan K. V., Principal, KPPM College of Teacher Education, Anakkayam, Malappuram, delivered an informative talk on the implementation of Indian Knowledge System in NEP 2020. He explained that the main aim of NEP 2020 is to provide inclusive and quality education and promote lifelong learning. The policy focuses on developing creativity, literacy, numeracy, and higher-order thinking skills. He also highlighted the importance of sustainable development and its connection with education, focusing on human, environmental, economic, and social aspects. The policy ensures equal access to education through different learning methods, better facilities, and support for dropout students. He further explained the importance of integrating Indian Knowledge System into education by including traditional knowledge, arts, culture, and languages in the curriculum. He also introduced modern teaching methods such as planning, teaching, evaluation, and feedback, and discussed the benefits of NEP 2020 like holistic development, critical thinking, flexibility in learning, and experiential learning. He also explained the changing role of teachers as guides and facilitators.

The webinar concluded with important ideas on strengthening cultural identity, promoting value-based education, encouraging innovation based on tradition, and enhancing community participation. The session was very informative and helped student teachers to understand the

importance of Indian knowledge in modern education. Overall, the webinar was a meaningful learning experience for all participants.
